Council passes 2021 Operational and Capital Budgets with 0% Increase

At the April 26th, 2021 Regular Village Council Meeting, the Council for the Village of Marwayne approved the 2021 Operational and Capital Budgets. Given the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Council is pleased to advise that they did not endeavor to increase the budget in 2021. As such, the budget remains the same as 2020 with \$458,671 to be collected through municipal taxation.

Council subsequently adopted Bylaw 583-21 authorizing the 2021 rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property. As a result of the Village's decrease in residential and commercial assessment by \$1,305,330, Council elected to raise the municipal mill rate in order to generate sufficient revenue to balance the budget. The 2021 minimum parcel levy remains set to \$850, the residential mill rate has increased to 10.0 and the non-residential mill rate increased to 14.4 for the current fiscal year.

Residents and business owners alike should expect to receive their tax notices in mid to late May. Please be aware that taxes for both residential and commercial properties are due in full on or before June 30th, 2021. Failure to remit payment by the deadline will result in a 12% penalty being applied on July 1st, 2021 to any outstanding balance. An additional penalty of 6% will be applied for all accounts remaining unpaid as of January 1st, 2022.

To assist our residents in their understanding of their notice of assessment we have prepared and will be including an information sheet in your respective envelope. 


DID YOU KNOW...

...The name Marwayne is a combination of the first syllables of Marfleet and Waynefleet, the former being the family name of some of our original pioneers, the latter that of their native town in Lincolnshire, England.

Settlement of our district began around 1903. On a scow built at the old Water's mill in Edmonton, a number of future residents and their belongings, traveled traveled the 200 mile journey down the Saskatchewan River producing 'a most novel and interesting experience for these new arrivals from the old land.'

The scow was later broken up and the salvaged lumber used in the construction of Marwayne's first home.

- Put your treasures on your FRONT Boulevard on May 29th
- Residents are encouraged to tour around town looking for treasures to take home and the best part is they are free!
- Some acceptable items could be: fridges, stoves, freezers, furniture, sinks, dishwashers, snow blowers, lawnmowers, patio furniture, barbecues, windows, bikes.... (If they are not in working order, please put a sign on item)

If Big items are not picked up Public Works will come around on **Monday, May 31st** to assess what needs to be hauled to the dump. To save time and money the public works department will only assess and pick up off a street ONCE so be sure to have your items out by 8am May 31st.

REMEMBER we WILL NOT pick up anything that can be placed in your large waste bins. This is ONLY for **Big Items.** Some items that will not be picked up by the Village are: Shingles, Gyp Roc, cement/concrete, car parts or motors of any kind, animal waste...

Derry was also a 3rd generation farmer/rancher, so quite a few young people got to do dual duty. This especially true in the case of his nephew Randy Jackson.


Derry's outgoing personality will be missed by his family and many friends



WHO IS THE WALKING THROUGH GRIEF SOCIETY?

Walking Through Grief Society has just held their second Covid AGM. With not being able to open the meeting to the public, perhaps the community is not aware of the Society's existence and what the Society actually offers and does in the community.

Here are some questions that are asked-

Who is the Walking Through Grief Society?

Walking Through Grief Society is a non profit agency available to support and companion those experiencing life losses and are finding coping difficult.

What is the Society's Mission and Goal?

The Society believes that grief is normal after any life loss.

Grief affects people of all ages and all walks of life.

Each person should be allowed to grieve in their own healthy, unique way.

Each needs a safe supportive, respectful and welcoming environment in which to process their grief.

The Society exists to ensure that no one needs to journey unsupported through grief.

Who does Walking Through Grief Society serve?

The Society has support programs for Adults in group or one to one and Children's group (Hope After Loss – Audra's Legacy) for ages 6-16.

The Society supports those grieving life losses ie: death, divorce, job, pet, - relationship and those impacted by trauma loss.

The Society serves those who are terminally ill and their families and those who are institutionalized.

What area does the Walking Through Society serve?

Walking Through Grief Society serves the marketing area of City of Lloydminster, Towns of Vermilion and Wainwright, Villages of Kitscoty and Marwayne and the County of Vermilion River. The Society is also open to calls from out of our area.

Who makes up the Walking Through Grief Society?

A volunteer Board of II people

Trained volunteer facilitators for Adult groups in Lloydminster, Vermilion and Wainwright.

Trained volunteer facilitators for the Hope After Loss- Audra's Legacy program.

How is the Walking Through Grief Society funded?

The Walking Through Grief Society is totally operated by volunteers and funding to support the Society is from FCSS grant contributions and public donations.

Because of this support financially and the fact that all the facilitators are volunteer there is no cost to the public but donations are always gratefully accepted.




