Calling all Volunteers for our Lead Testing Program!

The Village of Marwayne is seeking volunteers to have the water from their homes tested for lead. Typically, lead levels in source water are very low and the finished drinking water produced at water treatment plants is virtually lead-free. However, lead can leach into drinking water from tin-lead solder, brass fittings and some water meters. Lead-containing materials were more commonly used in the past, and consequently occur more frequently in older homes. That being said, recent construction does not eliminate the risk of lead leaching into drinking water. As such, the Village of Marwayne is pleased to advise that we will be randomly sampling homes within the Village boundary for lead in order to comply with our mandate from Alberta Environment. If you would like to volunteer your home for sampling, and your residence meets the eligibility criteria, please email marwayne@mcsnet.ca. Volunteers who meet the eligibility criteria will be

contacted and forwarded the applicable paperwork and consent form to participate in the program. We thank all those interested however only twenty (20) homes will be selected for testing over the next two (2) year period.

The Village is in search of homes who meet the following criteria:

- Twelve (12) Single Family Units built before 1960
- Four (4) Single Family Units built between 1960 and 1975
- Two (2) Single Family Units built after 1975
- Two (2) Multi Family Units

CHANGES WITHIN AND WITHOUT

CHANGES- "Change creates loss ", "Loss creates change"

In your times of loss you may be facing a flow of changes. You may have feelings of unreality, uncertainness, fearfulness of the future. What are you thinking? These are feelings that may move you toward isolating in your pain. We may choose to isolate , feeling it is a safe place or recently we have experienced an enforced isolation due to the pandemic. Both isolations have their roots in loss (a fear of the future and how we will cope in the new and uncertain times.)

Are you feeling depressed? Are there more clouds than sunshine in your lives? Negativity begins to set in and we stuff our emotions. Often we don't realize we are depressed and don't recognize the symptoms; negativity, anger, edginess, disconnected, no energy, feeling hopeless, self loathing and can't see a future, to name some. This is a time to reach out and seek a new path that leads to Hope. Reach out to find support in a trusted friend, a counsellor or a supportive group.

Coping skills - Do you feel you have any? Don't let the grief pain become overwhelming. Find a supportive network that can be an anchor for you. Try finding a gratitude for each day (a flower amidst the ashes). Be able to name your emotions and courageously dig into them. That is where healing begins. Try to remember self care. You are worth it. Spend some time in a "grief break"; take time for a walk, exercise, write, listen to soothing music, draw or paint, read or work in a garden.

Resilience – The ability to return to the place of using strengths learned. The coping skills you have learned you will use and reuse in your changing life. (If you receive lemons, be able to make lemonade). Use self affirmations and share a positive thought with someone. Gratitude and positivity changes the brain's functions. You have the ability to move through your grief pain and move forward.

Hope – We end with Hope. Hope as small as a mustard seed, is where we start. Practice it and hope will grow. Hope that each new day will bring healing, new coping skills, resilience, a supportive network that help to move forward one small step at a time, being able to say "I can make it".

Please remember our children, they too experience all the pain and emotion we as adults do and as they experience changes and the pain of their grief they need our support and understanding.

DON'T FORGET TO PURCHASE/RENEW YOUR PET LICENSE

As per the Village of Marwayne's Animal Control Bylaw No. 557-17, pet licenses are required for all cats and dogs within our municipality. Residents must license their animals on a yearly basis by remitting payment to the Village administration office by cash, cheque or online banking. The fee for licensing your dog and/or cat is \$30.00 per animal. Failure to license your animals may result in fines and/or enforcement on a case by case basis.



Just a friendly reminder that no more than three (3) dogs, cats, or combination thereof, are permitted per residence within the Village of Marwayne. The Village has been receiving numerous complaints of residents in violation of this maximum and will be following up with those individuals accordingly.

Lastly, in consideration of your neighbors and the community as a whole, please ensure your dogs are not left outside if they are prone to barking incessantly. Owners whose animals disturb the peace are guilty of an offence under the Village's Animal Control Bylaw No. 557-17 and are subject to the applicable fines and/or enforcement.
