

TAKE A MINUTE/ DO YOU HAVE A MINUTE?

"Take a Minute", the theme of the International Association of Suicide Prevention and the World Health Organization for the year 2020, is held on September 10th and set aside to recognize those who have lost loved ones and to focus on Mental Illness and improving Mental Health.

World Suicide Prevention Day began in 2003, to be held on September 10th yearly. IASP and WHO co sponsor this day. Statistics record that an average of 3000 complete suicide daily while at least 20 more attempt. There is strong evidence though that indicate that adequate prevention can reduce Suicide risks.

How can we be part of the change? "Taking a minute to reach out to someone in your community – a family member, friend, colleague or even a stranger – could change the course of another's life" (from isap).

Gain knowledge about suicide risks and mental illness and about the resources that are available for those at risk and those who need to become more educated. Have a change of mind – that reaching out to someone to intervene, by our conversation cause the situation to worsen.

Having personal inner skills to prevent a tragedy; empathy, compassion, nonjudgement, a desire to help and the ability to LISTEN (Take a minute). Knowing resources to share can restore HOPE.

Know the signs of distress; hopelessness, rage, uncontrolled anger, seek revenge, acting recklessly, feelings of being trapped in a situation, increase in alcohol or drug consumption, sleep disturbance (irregularity) or dramatic mood changes.

Be sincere; reach out, just be present and LISTEN

There is support for those impacted by the death of a loved one to suicide and for those who are in distress and are listed below.

This year the Lloydminster Suicide Walk of Remembrance has been cancelled due to covid but will take on a different format. We encourage people to get involved on September 10th, 2020:

Calling all Volunteers for our Lead Testing Program!

The Village of Marwayne is seeking volunteers to have the water from their homes tested for lead. Typically, lead levels in source water are very low and the finished drinking water produced at water treatment plants is virtually lead-free. However, lead can leach into drinking water from tin-lead solder, brass fittings and some water meters. Lead-containing materials were more commonly used in the past, and consequently occur more frequently in older homes. That being said, recent construction does not eliminate the risk of lead leaching into drinking water. As such, the Village of Marwayne is pleased to advise that we will be randomly sampling homes within the Village boundary for lead in order to comply with our mandate from Alberta Environment. If you would like to volunteer your home for sampling, and your residence meets the eligibility criteria, please email marwayne@mcsnet.ca.

Volunteers who meet the eligibility criteria will be contacted and forwarded the applicable paperwork and consent form to participate in the program. We thank all those interested however only twenty (20) homes will be selected for testing over the next two (2) year period.

The Village is in search of homes who meet the following criteria:

- Twelve (12) Single Family Units built before 1960
- Four (4) Single Family Units built between 1960 and 1975
- Two (2) Single Family Units built after 1975
- Two (2) Multi Family Units



2020 TAXES DUE

As per the 2020 Property Tax Bylaw No. 581-20, all property taxes payable to the Village of Marwayne be due and payable in full on or before **September 30th**, **2020**

On the 1st day of October, 2020, a penalty of 6% will be applied and added to any current taxes not paid on or before September 30th, 2020.

On the 1st day of January, 2021, a penalty of 12% will be applied and added to any arrears taxes not paid on or before December 31st, 2020.

Pastor's Notes

Time To Stand Up

John 3:16 (KJV)

[16] For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

This scripture is probably one of the most proliferate scripture in the world. It encapsulates the gospel message, the life of Jesus and the eternal destiny of all whose faith is found in him. It has been paraded abroad through sports events to bumper stickers. And while this great word is the hope of the church, not the world; the next few scriptures written by John really bring attention to those who do not have faith in the son of God.

[17] For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.[18] He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.[19] And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.[20] For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved.

The stark contrast between the light of God's salvation and the evil that is propagated by this world is becoming much more prevalent. Disappearing rapidly is the soft area that many Christians have tried to walk in, where they have friendship with the evil works of darkness but profess to be a believer in Christ. One day soon, in this country and those countries that once professed Christianity, there will be a profound mark of delineation between the works of evil and the works of light. There always has been, because one cannot mix the two, but the toleration between the two has allowed for the works of darkness to grow without hinderance.

That is to the shame of those who walk in light. It is time that those whose faith is truly in Christ, to stand against the works of darkness and condemn them, not counting the cries of intolerance that will be hurled at them. Persecution is a mark the church needs to be willing to take. As Jesus said, John 15:18 (KJV)

[18] If the world hate you, ye know that it hated me before it hated you.

It is time for us, as Christians, to stand against the evil, and pray the light of the gospel into the hearts of those headed for an eternal destiny of hell and damnation; no matter what the circumstances. Stand Up.
