#### Village of Marwayne Operations & Service Level Provision

With the winter weather upon us, the Village of Marwayne is working hard to ensure that snow removal is conducted in a timely manner on all Village streets, sidewalks, parking lots and back alleys. Unfortunately, the Village is currently short staffed and without an operational grader for the time being. As such, we ask for our residents' understanding and cooperation as we put forth our best efforts to provide snow removal and intersection sanding services to the community.

As per Policy PW01, snow removal is not conducted until a minimum of three (3) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our main streets and six (6) inches of snow cover has accumulated on our residential streets. Provided that the minimum amount of snow accumulation has been achieved, the Village then conducts snow removal on a priority basis—Area 1 (Railway Avenue, Centre Street, 1st Street S to the back alley near the Fire Hall, and 2nd Street S from Highway 897 to 2nd Avenue S), Area 2 (2nd Street S from the school to the manors, 3rd Street N, 2nd Avenue S, 1st Street N, 1st Avenue N&S and 2nd Avenue N from the Water Treatment Plant to Railway Avenue), Area 3 (2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th Avenue N, 1st Avenue S, and 3rd Street S) and lastly, Area 4 (back alleys, driveways, arena and curling rink parking lots). As has always been the case, snow removal on the sidewalks adjacent to personal residences and/or businesses remain the responsibility of the owner and must be cleared within twenty four (24) hours of a major snowfall.

Further, as per Policy PW01, sanding occurs only on an as needed basis on those intersections approved by Council—Area 1, the School Zone, Centre Street, Back Alley Abutments, the Curve on North Railway Avenue and the inclines on 3rd Avenue North and 2nd Avenue South. All snow removal/salting/sanding on Highway 897 is the responsibility of Alberta Transportation and all snow removal /salting/sanding on 5th Street South (Township 524) is conducted by the County of Vermilion River.

The Village of Marwayne would like to remind our residents as well as the visitors to our community to please drive according to the road conditions, in addition to obeying all traffic laws and signage. Again, the Village of Marwayne sincerely thanks you for your patience and understanding as we do our best to provide the greatest level of service possible given the current setbacks we are facing.

The only satellite site open on Thursday in the winter is Dewberry and it will close at 2:00 PM on Dec 24 and 31.


As of right now the garbage pick up days will remain the same. Please have your garbage out the night before or first thing to ensure pick up.

# IMPORTANT TAX NOTICE

As per the 2020 Property Tax Bylaw No. 581-20, all property taxes payable to the Village of Marwayne were due and to be paid in full on or before September 30, 2020 with a 6% penalty applied on the 1st day of October 2020.

On the 1st day of January, 2021, an additional penalty of 12% will be applied and added to any arrears taxes not paid on or before December 31st, 2020.

If 2019 tax arrears aren't paid by December 31, 2020, your property will be subject to tax recovery.


#### Marwayne Fire & Rescue




The Library will be closed from December 18<sup>th</sup> – January 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### DREADS OR HOPE FOR DECEMBER

Already I hear the dreads of this month. The lack of funds to buy gifts, being alone for the holiday, embracing the pain of loss and trying to navigate the grief journey and the isolation and uncertainness that is felt due to Covid restrictions. Many are also feeling more depression and with less hope.

How can community support those who are feeling such deep pain and how can those grieving recognize their needs and find a safe and supportive friend or group.

Grief is hard work and those who grieve will feel some; physical, emotional ,behavioral and spiritual symptoms of grief. Many will experience role changes and there is a sense of confusion, isolation and depression ,feeling hopeless and helpless. These feelings are increased and heightened by Covid. Many may fear what lies ahead and wonder if they will survive , or even care if they do.

Learn all you can about the Grief Journey , to empower and help you face each day.

- This month be kind to yourself, plan but don't use all your energy in planning. Take some quiet time to reflect and remember positive memories.
- Put memories into action by preparing a favorite dish, sending a positive message to a friend or family and a memory of your loved one. Donate in memory of your loved one.
- Care for and value yourself. Eat nutritionally (even if you don't have an appetite), go for a walk or run (something we can do even during Covid), listen to music, play and instrument or sing, draw or paint or journal.
- Accept your limits. (Remember grieving is hard work and you may feel exhausted)
- Create a new tradition (a good year to try), Perhaps next year you can go back to what was comforting.
- Be honest with your feelings and recognize other family members may grieve differently.
- Recognize that loss has created a change in you. Embrace your change as you journey through grief and find hope and a gift of gratitude.

For those who support the grieving ,you may wonder what can I do for them , what kind of gift can I give?

- Give them your hands to assist where needed and don't predetermine what is needed.( What you determine needs to be thrown out might be of emotional value.)
- Can you give your heart of compassion? (seeing from behind the griever's eyes). A heart that asks , "How would I want to be treated?"

THEN REACH OUT AND GIVE. , and perhaps you can have a Christmas heart all year.
