Over the past several months, the Village of Marwayne has carried out a review of our Municipal Development Plan (MDP). The MDP is a statutory planning document that sets the long-term framework for land use, growth, and development within a community. The update of the Village's MDP is a reflection of the way in which Council sees Marwayne growing and developing in the years to come.



In addition to the proposed updates to the MDP, the Village has also identified portions of the Land Use Bylaw (LUB) which require amending. The suggested changes to the LUB are designed as a means for the Village of Marwayne to carry out it's strategic plan of ensuring a quality of life in a safe, viable and thriving community. The Village invites you to come and discuss the MDP and LUB on Monday March 9th from 4:30pm to 7:00pm in the Husky Room at the Marwayne Community Hall—210 Second Avenue South.

Obituary of Rodney James Carson



Rodney James Carson was born March 21, 1950 to Ted & Betty Carson of Marwayne Alberta. He passed away suddenly at the U of A Hospital in Edmonton on January 11, 2020 at the age of 69 after suffering a massive stroke. Rodney spent his life in the Marwayne area where he resided until his passing. After graduating from high school, he spent some time working in Fort McMurray before returning to Marwayne to farm with his dad. He farmed for a few years and started raising cattle, while also driving truck, hauling logs and cattle. Rodney enjoyed raising cattle and so he continued having cattle while he pursued other endeavors. He became a Commercial Pilot and Pilot Instructor and had a spray plane business for a few years. Later he worked in the Oilfield, took his "B" Pressure Welding ticket and was a Supervisor for several years in the oilfield. After having cattle for

several years, he sold them and rented out his land. He started his own Consulting Business and spent several more years in the Oilfield, before retiring. He was a very well liked and respected man. Rodney was always there for anyone who needed help. He loved his children and grandchildren and was very proud of them all and was always available to help if he could. Rodney leaves to mourn his four children; Dani (Calvert), David, Billy and Keegan and their families as well as Lorraine Yakemchuk of Vegreville and her two daughters; Kim and Carmen and their families, his siblings; Brant Carson and Penney Ford and family. A private family burial will take place in the spring.

In Billy's words...... Rodney was the most interesting person I've ever met. Knew the answers to any question or idea. Clever, funny, charming. A pilot, welder, consultant, inspector, diver, traveler and a cattleman. Broke horses, broke bones, crashed planes and fought a tiger. Raised cattle, horses, goats, dogs, cats and a whole bunch of kids and grandkids.

One hell of a storyteller, cowboy and heart. Our Dad !

We are used to greeting our loved ones with hellos and endearments and sharing memories. Who would ever think that life would so drastically change and they would become strangers to us.

Each hello and good-bye are now days on the long journey called "grief", as a little of our loved one is lost (their person, personality, memories). We may feel alienated and that our loved one has forgotten us (grief of rejection). Or as they no longer remember family, and family names and memories of family (grief of the loss of connectedness and closeness of the familiar). As a family we may feel cheated of the life and love we knew (grief of the dream of what the future could have looked like.)

Caring for our loved one becomes stressful and confusing, a sense of helplessness takes over and we just don't know how to make "it" better. Care giving is mentally and physically exhausting. There are so many emotions to deal with and decisions to make for the support and care of our loved one and what we need for self care. Be sure you reach out to support groups, doctors, supportive friends from community or church. It takes a team to walk with you on your journey.

The loved one who is dealing with Dementia/Alzheimer's is also feeling alone and grieves losses that are occurring. These feeling may come out in anger, fear, confusion, depression, and isolation. Below is a prayer entitled "Alzheimer's Prayer" (author unknown)

Please grant my visitors tolerance for my confusion, forgiveness for my irrationality and strength to walk with me into the mist of memory my world has become.

Please help them take my hand and stay awhile, even though I seem unaware of their presence. Help them to know how their strength and loving care will drift softly into the days to come just when I need it most.

Let them know when I don't recognize them that I will, I will

Keep their hearts free of sorrow for me- for my sorrow, when it comes, only lasts a moment- then it is gone.

And finally Lord, please let them know how very much their visits mean, how even through this relentless mystery – I can feel their love. .Amen.
