

Marwayne Baby Beef Club (4-H club) was formed in approximately 1940 and had twenty members. The first sale held in conjunction with the Lloydminster Bull


Sale showed 22 calves selling at an average of 770 lbs with the price paid averaging out at 12 cents per pound.

#### Newsletter Submission - Re: Disposal of Batteries

### Vermilion River Regional Waste Management Services Commission


Due to the potential fire hazard that can be caused by damaged rechargeable lithium-ion batteries including, but not limited to, those batteries used in cell phones, tablets and other electronic devices, and rechargeable batteries used in power tools and equipment, the Vermilion River Regional Waste Management Services Commission asks that anyone using any of our transfer sites must declare any batteries that they want to dispose of when entering the site. If the transfer site has a regulated disposal bin for batteries, the patron will be directed to the correct disposal receptacle.

Any small batteries including disposable alkaline batteries, and any rechargeable lithium-ion batteries such as those found in electronic devices such as cell phones and tablets, or rechargeable small tool batteries must be disposed of in the designated hazardous waste bin. Transfer sites that have a regulated hazardous waste bin are located at the Vermilion, Kitscoty, Marwayne, Dewberry and Paradise Valley sites. We ask our patrons not to dispose of these batteries at the Tulliby Lake or Preston transfer sites. Please take them to one of the other sites that do accept batteries.

The Vermilion River Regional Waste Management Services Commission will continue to take lead-acid automotive batteries. These batteries must also be declared at the gate and patrons will be directed to the regulated disposal bin for these types of batteries. Not all transfer sites have regulated bins for accepting lead-acid bins, and patrons will be informed at the gate if they have to be taken to another site for disposal. Tulliby Lake and Dewberry transfer sites cannot accept lead-acid batteries at this time.

We would like to make our patrons aware of the potential extreme fire hazard that can be caused by damaged lithium-ion batteries. Damaged batteries can reach 600 degrees Celsius if they are ignited. They burn very quickly and smoke from the flames can be harmful to the respiratory system and vision of anyone that is in close vicinity to the flames.





PLEASE DISPOSE OF YOUR USED BATTERIES RESPONSIBLY AND HELP US MAINTAIN THE SAFETY OF OUR SITES FOR OUR STAFF, CONTRACTORS AND PATRONS.

#### HINT OF SPRING - IN OUR GARDEN OF GRIEF

There is a change in the season and there are changes on our grief journey.

Changes and good-byes care painful and times of fear of what the future will be like. The feeling of life "out of control" and fears of adjusting to a new and different course in our lives. Acceptance is not an overnight happening but a gradual change, just as the seasons. It can be a time of an emotional roller- coaster.

When in this time in our lives we need to look at how we are going to cope. We need some coping tools for our emotional grief garden.

#### 1. LOOKING AT LIFE'S ALTERNATIVES:

Acceptance of life as it is now and having the courage and ability to look at choices and changes that will happen for the tomorrows. Life is like a river ever changing and moving. We cannot stay rooted in the pain of today or a fixed picture of what life "is", we have to be open to there being an alternative to where we are now.

- USING OUR MEMORIES :( sum total of what we can remember). Persons and relationships never die but become memories. We can take back some control of our lives and our grief journey when we are in charge of our memories and can recall good ones and shut out bad ones. Sometimes those memories will cause tears but later on our journey we will be able to laugh and cry too. Embrace the past but hold it gently as you move forward.
- 3. VERBALIZE FEELINGS AND THOUGHTS TO A SUPPORT PERSON: Finding and utilizing that support person or group is a vital tool to healing and moving forward. Sharing without shame or fear, feelings of "crazy", anger, sadness, joy or relief, all part of the grief journey. "No man is an island unto himself" We need people to talk to, to heal and become a new wholeness. Do not forget

the children and other members of the family who are all on their own journey, too. We can share the gift of honesty, with ourselves and the others in our family and have a concern with where they are on their journey. We can encourage and listen to their feelings and emotions and help them find supportive people.

#### 4. BEGIN THE USE OF PROBLEM SOLVING:

A) Look at what problem you are facing and state it.

B) Begin to express how you feel about it.

C) Find a trustworthy person to share what you are experiencing.

D) Seek support and insight from others who are in similar situations.

E) Realize you are the only person you can change. Get out those coping tools, take courage, you are in charge of tending your grief garden.

The Chamber of Commerce had its beginnings as the Marwayne Board of Trade in 1926. In 1932 it became known as Marwayne Civic Affairs and in 1962 became the Marwayne and District Chamber of Commerce.

Today the majority of the Chamber's income is generated from the RV Park that was established in 1982. The campground had to be relocated and rebuilt in 2011 to make room for the new Community Hall.

A portion of the income generated by the campground is annually turned over to the Ag Society and the Economic Development Committee.

Over the years the Chamber has used funds remaining after campground expenses, to sponsor various projects, including the rodeo breakfast, community flower barrels and school bursaries. Financial support is also provided for the rodeo street dance and Christmas "Light up Marwayne" event.

Over the years, the underlying purpose of the Chamber has been the promotion of business within the Village and surrounding area. The committee has recently coordinated advertising for local businesses in tourism publications.

Membership is open to anyone in the community and fresh ideas and input is always welcome and you do not have to commit to another monthly meeting, because most "meetings" are conducted by email or text messages.


