



Water Main Repair

The Village of Marwayne received a call from a ratepayer hearing the sound of water running and the Utility Department was able to identify it as a connection malfunction on the water main. HHD Ltd were available the next day and repairs were promptly made on July 6th with limited interruptions in water supply to residents.



Notice Of Periodic Office Closures:

I have often heard the question. "Will I ever find purpose in my life again?" Finding purpose is challenging and takes some committed working through but can happen. We use self talk reasons why we disengage from life, and withdraw socially and emotionally. It is protective and adaptive when you only have so much energy to focus where needed (survival for day to day).

When there is the urge to retreat from life in the short term is normal but be careful that it doesn't become long term. Depression and grief are much the same and by retreating you cut yourself off from sources of support, coping skills and positive emotion and hope.

A therapy called "Behavioral Activation" looks at increased activity, increased social support, well-being, positive feelings and increased confidence. This reasoning can be used for those who grieve as well. Remember this takes conscious effort and a willingness to move forward rather than retreat. This won't be a steady move forward but will seem to plateau or regress. (Caution to make sure it is for a short time). Have you stopped doing things since the death of a loved one, things you used to find joy in, that you do no more? Reasoning may be;

You don't have time any more

They require too much effort

They remind you of your loved one (and that causes pain)

The activities seem less fun now.

You are worth the effort! By engaging and bravely launching you may find outlets, supportive friends, journaling, art, music, exercise, and a support group experiencing similar grief.

Ask yourself, what does my typical day look like? Write it down.

Make a plan and include a friend in that plan.

Implement the plan, check back to number 1. Look at what works best to fit into your day. Involve a friend or just muster up all your courage to do IT. Perhaps have an accountability person in your life to help keep you on track.

Just do it! Don't excuse yourself out. Pay attention to how you are feeling. Compare how you felt at your worst and do you feel any better. If yes, that is good if it is no, then ask why and that can be useful information as well.

Be prepared for the hard work of finding purpose again. It will be difficult but please believe that it will be worth it in time.

May you find hope and purpose in this the "first day of the rest of your life".
