

ACE Regional Water Service begins in Marwayne The Village of Marwayne is set to begin receiving potable water from the Alberta Central East (ACE) water system beginning in February 2019 providing our citizens with a long term, reliable water source.



This regional project (thirteen municipalities located in eastern Alberta) initiated in response was to the Government of Alberta's Water for Life Strategy—a long term strategy developed in 2003 to ensure safe, secure drinking water for all Albertans, while recognizing the limitations on raw water supplies.

The source of water is changing from deep well ground water to surface water sourced from the North Saskatchewan River (via the City of Lloydminster and ACE Water Treatment Facility). With the transition to a new water source residents can expect to notice some differences in the water. It is very important for owners of water softening systems to have the equipment calibrated by their service providers as the hardness level and chemical composition of surface water can vary from well water. The regeneration frequency of water softeners may be impacted by this change.

The Council of the Village of Marwayne will soon be amending their water rate billed

to customers starting with February's bill to reflect the expense of purchasing ACE

Water. Details on those amendments will be made available once the Bylaw is passed on our website and at the Village Office.

DID YOU KNOW...

....The original Marwayne Community Hall was originally erected in the early 30's and



was used as a theatre, among other things, for showing movies in the months the roads were kept open for cars. The movies were put on by a man named Mr Kent Purdy from Edmonton with shows starting in 1933. It wasn't until the 1940's that the theatre was able to

be kept open all year long. This would last into the 70's where business dropped off and movies were no longer shown. The business had changed hands from Mr Purdy to Harvey Corr and finally ended with Lawrence Perks as owner.



"BROKEN" How are you feeling? Is your heart feeling broken?

February is considered the month of romance with flowers, cards, candy, poetry, etc.

February can also be a very hard month of reminders of this not being the norm. For many it is the reminder of love lost through death and the grief journey they are on and emptiness they feel. There is another loss that is experienced that is often not spoken of or thought of and that is the loss of broken relationships (divorce and separation). Broken hearts and broken dreams of "happily ever after".

This state of brokenness creates a change, loss and grieving process. Though not always talked about still felt deeply. New feelings and experiences emerge. Isolation, job and financial demands as a single, diminished personal self-worth, loneliness, depression, which can lead to substance abuse and mental health issues.

Stats in Alberta in 2011 indicate that 327,024 people were going through divorce or separation. Alberta has the highest rate of divorce and separation, and also for substance abuse and gambling. Stats Canada reported in 2016 that children also impacted by divorce and separation, living with one parent was 5,733,935. 2 in 10 of those aged 0-14 are with one parent and 1 in 10 with a step family. 1.4%, live in a home without parents.

Is there anything that would help to deal with the deep sadness of grief, and feeling of brokenness? Firstly, recognizing that this is a time of grieving just as in any loss and this effects both you and your children. Learn about the grief process and find positive supports for both you and your children. Suggested supports are empowerment course at Interval Home, Mental Health counsellor or other counsellors, positive friends and family. What do you think about support groups that come together to share and learn in a safe supportive environment and support for the children with support groups to share with other children and a have a sense of feeling "normal" with other children. Working through grief will help in healing the brokenness and work toward a new beginning.








MARWAYNE PUBLIC LIBRRAY

Number Your House

Displaying your house number prominently and accurately is critically important. In the case of a fire, medical emergency or other scenario during which emergency personnel need to find your home in a hurry, every second counts. A properly displayed house number can provide those valuable seconds.



A house number also helps you provide directions to visitors and make delivery services run smoothly.

To ensure visibility of your house number, the Village of Marwayne suggests:

- that numbers be 3" to 5" high,
- positioned by the main entrance or positioned over a garage entrance
- located at least four feet off the ground,
- clearly visible from the street

If you already have your number installed, please walk out in front of your house. Can you see your number from the street? Are their bushes blocking the view? There are no numbers missing? And the address is well lit at night?

House numbers and road names are used to identify homes and businesses for Emergency 9-1-1 service. Every home and business has been assigned a number. If you do not know your number, or would like to confirm what your number is, please call the Village of Marwayne Office at 780-847-3962.
