Another "ADDITION" to the Fire Hall

The Village of Marwayne is pleased to announce that our new Rosenbauer Stock Tanker #5-3 has officially arrived! On Tuesday August 2nd, 2023, the Village of Marwayne joined the County of Vermilion River for a push in ceremony at the fire hall to celebrate the new addition to our fleet.

The new Tanker is able to carry 3000 gallons of water, foam and has a fire pump. It also comes with a front mounted nozzle turret which allows the tanker to switch to attack mode during a wildland interface fire. The new Tanker was purchased by the County of Vermilion River for \$462,000 as part of their Fire Master Plan. The Village and the County work together to service areas as far as Township Road 514—North past Tulliby Lake—East towards the Saskatchewan border and West all the way to the curve of the North Saskatchewan River.

Having the right equipment is key to success in preventing and responding to emergencies across the region. We are very thankful for our partnerships with our municipal neighbors as well as the opportunity to utilize the new tanker to serve the people of our community and surrounding areas!





SUICIDE SURVIVOR - A LONELY JOURNEY

Those who have lost a loved one to suicide often feel alone in their journey. They may experience stigmatization and there may be an uncomfortable silence surrounding them in their loss. They may not know if they should express the pain of their loss or to whom they feel safe in sharing. Isolation, loneliness, and abandonment by friends and community are commonly felt.

How can we as community and friends come alongside and companion those who have experienced such a great loss and deep pain? Can you accept the intensity of their pain? Grief of the Suicide Survivor is complex. The following considerations may be helpful.

Be patient. Emotions that are experienced are often overwhelming including guilt, fears, anger, shame, and many more that may surface at any time.

Be an active listener. Be present. Break the costly silence and begin to be an active listener without judgements, a valuable helping skill. Be focused on what the individual says and not what you are going to say. You may hear their story many times, so be present as this is part of the healing journey.

Be compassionate. Be a safe place for those grieving to talk. Never indicate that "you know how they feel" or offer old cliches, such as, "time heals wounds", or "you have to be strong." Rather use the words "I seek to understand how you feel." This can help you to remember that you are companioning and need to be comfortable with a range of emotions and feelings.

Be respectful. Perhaps those grieving are not ready to share their thoughts and feelings. Let them know you will be there when they are. Let them 'lead the dance,' so to speak. Remember there are many touched by this death that often go ignored and the silence of their wounds of grief go unhealed.

Be understanding. Each survivor will grieve uniquely as they are unique. There may be similarities but the key is "seeking to understand." There will be times on the journey where the pain will be triggered and intense, such as on anniversaries, holidays and special days that are remembered. Be patient, don't judge or criticize individuals navigating their lives being reconstructed.

Listen and learn of the spiritual aspect of their journey. Faith and Spirituality is a place on the journey of healing that usually is addressed. Let the survivor be your teacher as to their understanding of faith and spirituality. The following quote may be helpful: "Don't be in shock or judge when the anger is addressed toward God." Some people have the belief that those who complete suicide are bound for hell. Your task is not to explain theology but listen and learn of each person's individualized experience.

Provide support. The support for those grieving is important whether individual or in support groups where some similarities exist, and can allow for survivors to tell their stories as often as needed.

In closing, "To experience grief is the result of having loved. Suicide survivors must be guaranteed this necessity. While the above guidelines will be helpful, it is important to recognize that helping a suicide survivor heal will not be an easy task. You may have to give more concern, time and love than you ever knew you had. But this effort will be more than worth it. "




A Pastor's Gleanings
