2024 Utility Rate Increase

The Alberta Central East (ACE) Water Corporation has increased it's cost to purchase water by \$0.30 effective January 1st, 2024. This increase by ACE is the result of rising costs of purchasing water, chemicals, repairs, maintenance, operational contracts, first calls, board fees and utilities. ACE is working to approve a 3-year fixed cost of water, but until then, the Village of Marwayne must pass on the water rate increases to residents to recoup the additional costs. Further to this, the Vermilion River Regional Waste Management Services Commission also increased the yearly requisition for the Village of Marwayne for 2024 by \$11,499. As such, the cost per resident for garbage collection has increased by \$3.20 from \$26.50 to \$29.70.

The Village of Marwayne passed Bylaw No. 599-24 on January 15th, 2024 to incorporate the above noted price increases into our monthly utility rates. The new 2024 rates are as follows:

2024 Business Licenses

Business Licenses are up for renewal and due no later than February 28, 2024.

As per Business License Bylaw 567-18, every business operating within the Village shall as a prior condition of its operation, obtain a business license issued by the CAO or designate.

Council Meeting Highlights

- The Vermilion River Regional Waste Management Services Commission 2024 requisition was received as information. The overall increase for 2024 is \$11,499.
- The Alberta Central East Water Corporation met on December 21, 2023 and finalized their 2024 budget. As the cost of business has increased substantially, the ACE board voted to increase the cost for municipalities to purchase water by \$0.30.
- Council passed Bylaw No. 599-24 to amend the Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 544-15 for the 2024 utility rates.
- Council received correspondence from the Minister of Municipal Affairs regarding capital and operational funding under the Local Government Fiscal Framework which has replaced the Municipal Sustainability Initiative funding program. In 2024, the Village is expected to receive \$152,330 in operational funding and \$296,086 in capital funding.
- The Village is still looking for interested persons who wish to join the board of directors for the operation of the seniors center. Interested parties are encouraged to contact the Village administration office for more information.


Draft Area Structure Plan

The Village of Marwayne is pleased to provide our residents with the draft Area Structure Plan (ASP) for the 17 acre parcel adjacent to Highway 897. An Area Structure Plan is a statutory document that aligns with the Village of Marwayne's Municipal Development Plan. In accordance with the Municipal Government

Act, an ASP outlines the future development of an area with regard to land use, transportation, natural environment, proposed population density and utility service requirements. The ASP is approved by Council and adopted by bylaw. Having an ASP reduces land use conflicts and ad hoc development that can have an impact on the natural environment, council's fiscal budget, existing roads, water and wastewater systems, and surrounding land owners. This land is located along Hwy 897 and feeds into Hwy 45. 





AM I GRIEVING "THE RIGHT" WAY?

Have you ever heard someone ask this question or have you asked it of yourself? When someone is grieving there is a sense of feeling out of the normal. Afterall, you are on a new journey, and you may long to have some control and normalcy back in your life. It would be easier if there was only one way to grieve but remember we are all unique with unique journey through grief. We have unique personalities, circumstances around our loss, stressors, cultural influences, and varied supportive relationships.

One descriptive that most people relate to during their grief journey is that it feels like it hurts. Grief involves the total person with changed perspectives, world view, attitudes and often role changes. This can lead to emotional pain and wondering if this is the "right way" to grieve.

What is the purpose of going through the emotional pain? Dr. Alan Wolfelt, an expert on grief and loss, states "you have to feel the pain in order to heal the pain." Another expert, Dr. Nancy Reeves, offers the perspective that "we grieve for the implication and meaning of the loss and the intrapersonal (how it effects self esteem and self image) and interpersonal (how it effects relationships, roles and status)."

The grief process is somewhat like a spider web. Strands are connected yet we can't tell beforehand which strand we will need to travel on. So, when you find yourself questioning whether your grief is "normal," remember to be gentle with yourself while knowing your journey is the right way for you to move forward through grief.

The following mantras may be helpful for your journey:

I will be patient with myself and understand that grief often involves moving two steps forward and one back.

I will reach out to others for help when I need support.

I will avoid abusing substances as a way to temporarily minimize my pain.

I will care for myself physically.

I will not isolate myself from friends, hobbies, and activities.

I will avoid making major life decisions until I have worked the grief steps.

I will grieve in my own time and not by how others think I should grieve.

I will create a time and space to honor my emotions.

I will understand that grief reconciliation takes time, and I will commit to the journey even if relief comes slower than I would like.

I will remember that moving through grief often involves feeling painful and intense emotions.

I will remember that when I complete my grief work successfully, I can have a rich, although different life.


