



Council Meeting Highlights

- Council approved a \$250.00 donation to the Marwayne Jubilee School towards their physical education fundraising campaign. In return, the Village will be featured on their Wildcat Wall of Support.
- The Kitscoty Seniors extended an invitation to the Marwayne Seniors to partake in their monthly activities and events. This invitation has been circulated to the community as well as posted on our bulletin board and social media platforms.
- The downtown flower baskets are growing in the greenhouse and will be up for display around the first week of June!
- Council reviewed the costs associated with the Voices of the Village newsletter and determined that we would only provide the newsletter in paper format at the post office and the Village administration office. As a result, newsletters will no longer be placed in everyone's mailbox as there was a significant amount of newsletters unread and discarded. Newsletters will also always be viewable in electronic format on our website and via our Facebook page.
- Council reviewed the 2024 provincial budget as well as the Alberta Municipalities budget overview document. A copy of the budget overview is available on the Alberta Municipalities website.
- With warmer days and cooler nights, there is lots of snow melting and subsequently freezing, overnight. The Village of Marwayne does not use our equipment to scrape away ice, unless we deem it absolutely necessary for public safety and/or our infrastructure. We thank you for your patience and understanding as we endure the effects of the ever changing spring weather that is upon us.
- The Village has partnered with the City of Lloydminster, RM of Wilton, RM of Britannia, Town of Vermilion, Villages of Kitscoty and Paradise Valley, Towns of Lashburn and Marshall, and the RM of Eldon to execute a Regional Emergency Management Collective Strategy and Agreement.



MARWAYNE SPRING CLEANUP

Treasure Hunt will be Saturday May 11, 2024 for one day only

How it works:

Treasure Hunt is for reusable items! The stuff you know is still good but you don't want anymore. The treasure hunt is your opportunity to recycle appliances, furniture and other large items that can be re-used by someone else.

- Put your treasures on your FRONT Boulevard on May 11
- Residents are encouraged to tour around town looking for treasures to take home and the best part is they are free!
- Some acceptable items are: fridges, stoves, freezers, furniture, sinks, dishwashers, snow blowers, lawnmowers, patio furniture, barbecues, windows, bikes.... (If they are not in working order, please put a sign on item)

Do NOT put regular garbage, renovation materials, or your yard clean up bags as these will not be picked up. Additional information can be found at https://www.vermilion-river.com/ living here/waste transfer sites.html

If big items are not picked up, Public Works staff will come around on Monday, May 13 to assess what needs to be hauled to the dump. To save time and money, the Public Works department will only assess and pick up off a street <u>ONCE</u> so be sure to have your items out by 8 am May 13

REMEMBER we WILL NOT pick up anything that can be placed in your large waste bins. This is <u>ONLY</u> for **Big Items**. Some items that will not be picked up by the Village are: Shingles, Gyp Roc, cement/concrete, car parts or motors of any kind, animal waste, etc...

Please note during this week your items may be left on your boulevard for a few days while the Public Works Department is clearing other places in town.

RECONNECTING WITH LIFE AFTER LOSS

A common question from those grieving is: "Will I ever find purpose in my life again?" Finding purpose is challenging and takes committed working through, however, with time it can happen.

There may be many reasons why we disengage from life, and withdraw socially and emotionally. It is protective and adaptive when you only have so much energy to focus where needed (survival for day to day). The urge to retreat from life in the short-term is normal. Retreating may lead you cut yourself off from sources of support, coping skills and positive emotion and hope. Therefore, it is important to become aware of this impact to ensure retreating does not become your norm for the long-term.

There are many reasons that people retreat from others during their grief journey. You may relate with the following common reasons for retreating:

You feel distracted or as though you can't focus on anything other than your loss/grief.

You feel like you have to conserve your energy to deal with the emotion and stress of grief.

You feel as though the things you once enjoyed now seem meaningless or unimportant.

You disengage from activities because they remind you of your loved one.

You feel anxious about social interaction or being emotional in front of others.

The world no longer feels like a safe and reliable place.

Engaging in activities feels like a betrayal or as though you're "moving on"

You think you will feel better in time, so you decide to stay at home and wait it out.

A common therapy, cognitive behavioural therapy, uses a tool called "Behavioural Activation" to help increase activity, social support, well-being, positive feelings, and confidence. This tool can be helpful for grief. It requires a conscious effort and willingness to move forward rather than retreat. It may not be a steady move forward and may at times seem to plateau or regress. Remember that you are worth the effort. By engaging in behavioural activation you may launch yourself into finding new outlets, connecting with supportive friends, journaling, exploring art or music, participating in exercise, and/or locating a support group experiencing similar grief. The following steps may help with starting your behavioural activation:

Ask yourself, what does my typical day look like? Write it down.

Make a plan and include a friend in that plan.

Implement the plan, check back to step 1. Look at what works best to fit into your day. Involve a friend as an accountability person. Jump in and do it. Don't excuse yourself out. Pay attention to how you are feeling. Compare how you felt at your worst and do you feel any better.

Be prepared for the hard work of finding purpose again. It will be difficult but believe that it will be worth it in time.



A Pastor's Gleanings




Marwayne Public Library


