#### Council passes 2025 Operational and Capital Budgets

At the April 28th, 2025 Regular Village Council Meeting, the Council for the Village of Marwayne approved the 2025 Operational and Capital Budgets. The assessment for the Village has increased for this years Tax Notices, as a result the 2025 budget is \$13,823 with a total of \$532,188 to be collected through municipal taxation. Council adopted Bylaw 606-25 and 607-25 authorizing the 2025 rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property. The 2025 minimum parcel levy has increased \$100 to \$1,050 with the residential mill rate remaining at 10.8 and the non-residential mill rate remains at 14.7 for the current fiscal year.

Residents and business owners alike should expect to receive their tax notices late May. Please be aware that taxes for both residential and commercial properties are due in full on or before June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Failure to remit payment by the deadline will result in a 12% penalty being applied on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 to any outstanding balance. An additional penalty of 6% will be applied for all accounts remaining unpaid as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026. To assist our residents in their understanding of their notice of assessment we have prepared and will be including an information sheet in your respective tax notice envelope. Should you not be in receipt of your tax notice by the end of May, please contact our office. Failure to receive your tax notice does not exempt you from paying. Furthermore, given the ongoing delays at land titles, persons who purchased property in 2025 may or may not receive a tax notice. We strongly encourage you to discuss what payments were made and what amounts are outstanding with the lawyer who assisted you with your real estate transaction.

#### **Council Meeting Highlights**

- Council approved additional funds from the Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) to be implemented towards the senior connection program.
- Council has approved the Buffalo Trails Public Joint Use and Planning Agreement. The
  Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, Section 670.1 requires that all
  municipalities with school boards operating within their municipal boundaries must enter
  into a joint use planning agreement with the school board.
- Council approved Policy HR-08 Salary Grid as presented to help entice qualified employees for the municipality.
- 2025 Operational and Capital Budgets were approved.
- Council gave final readings to Bylaw No. 605-25 Borrowing Bylaw, a bylaw of the Village to incur indebtedness by the issuance of a debenture in the amount of \$236,038 for the purpose of the industrial park land development.
- Council gave final readings to the amendment of the Procedural Bylaw No. 608-25 to establish the procedures for the conduct of regular and special council meetings,





- Residents are encouraged to tour around town looking for treasures to take home and the best part is they are free!
- Some acceptable items are: fridges, stoves, freezers, furniture, sinks, dishwashers, snow blowers, lawnmowers, patio furniture, barbecues, windows, bikes.... (If they are not in working order, please put a sign on item)

Please note during this week your items may be left on your boulevard for a few days while the Public Works Department is clearing other places in town.

#### REMEMBERING THROUGH MOTHER'S DAY

Mother's Day can bring a mix of emotions, especially if you are dealing with grief and loss. It is a day that may try to catch your attention through department store specials, posts on social media, or through conversation with family and friends. This can make the absence of a mother, or a child, or even the relationship you wish you had, feel even heavier. If you are going through this, you are not alone. Here are a few ideas that can allow you to remember and honour your grief through this day:

Acknowledging Your Grief – Waves of grief can hit, especially on significant days. It is okay to feel sadness, anger, emptiness, etc. Whatever you feel, is a valid feeling. Create space for acknowledging your feelings by jotting it down in a notebook or taking time to yourself as needed.

Ways to Honour a Loved One – If it feels comforting, you might try one of the following on Mother's Day: lighting a candle, looking through old photos, writing a letter to your loved one, or doing something that they loved. If you are feeling up to celebrating, you might consider adding new rituals to help you continue to honour your loved one.

Connect With Someone You Trust – If the idea of Mother's Day is feeling hard, connect with a trusted loved one or trusted professional to create a space where you can talk this through in a safe, and nonjudgemental space. Having someone acknowledge and support you through this time can help emphasize the reality that you are not alone in this grief journey.

Alter Your Routines – Consider altering your routines during the Mother's Day period. For example, you may choose to take a social media break to reduce the number of Mother's Day posts you see to or treat this day as a special day where you prioritize activities that may allow you time for self-care.

If You're Grieving a Different Kind of Loss – Sometimes the grief we experience around Mother's Day is for a relationship that was complicated, distant, or painful. That kind of grief is also real. It is okay to mourn what never was, just as much as what was lost.

Sometimes the process of coming up with a plan A or plan B (or C-Z) for holidays can help you recognize that whatever you are able to do to remember Mother's Day this year, will be what works best for you in your grieving journey. There is no right or wrong way to grieve. Remember this as you navigate this year's Mother's Day.


